We are privileged to welcome this extraordinary artist to the MRT stage. You may remember Dael's *Until the Flood*, which was our first filmed show in the spring of 2021 after many months of closure. How grateful we are now to have Dael performing her work and in community with us.

I have long been enamored by Dael's work. My first professional job in the American Theatre was assistant

directing *Monster*, a piece which Dael wrote and performed at ACT in Seattle. Her writing illuminates all facets of humanity with fierceness and expansive creativity. What a master class I received witnessing her craft the show. Lucky for me, I have been able to stay in close touch with Dael for over twenty years. She has deservedly collected many awards, built multiple productions in the biggest theatres across the country, and stayed true to her singular voice.

With *Spiritus*, Dael explores death; how we depart, what impact our departure makes, and how we find meaning in the face of that inevitability. She has

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assembled a prolific team of artists including her long-time collaborator, Neel Keller, who leads with scorching intellect and voracious curiosity. We have benefited from rich collaborations with Contemporary American Theatre Festival and NYC's Rattlestick Theater to bring the production to life. I am certain this isn't the final stop for the production and I am honored MRT is where the commission originated.

I want to take this opportunity to thank you for joining us for the  $45^{\rm th}$  season. We hope to see you again next year as we announce titles for season 46. We couldn't do it without you.

Ms. Orlandersmith was a Pulitzer Prize finalist and Drama Desk Award nominee for Yellowman and the winner of the Susan Smith Blackburn Prize for *The Gimmick*. Dael is the recipient of a New York Foundation for the Arts grant, The Helen Merrill Award for Emerging Playwrights, a Guggenheim, along with several other awards and honors. Her play, FOREVER, was commissioned and performed at the Mark Taper Forum/Kirk Douglas Theatre Fall of 2014, followed by performances at the Long Wharf Theatre Winter of 2014/15, New York Theatre Workshop Spring 2015, and Portland Center Stage Winter of 2016. Her play *Until the Flood* was done at St Louis Repertory Fall of 2016. She is currently working on two commissions for Artists Repertory Theatre in Portland and Milwaukee Repertory Theatre. Until the Flood was done at Rattlestick Theatre in 2018 and Milwaukee Rep in 2019 it was done at Portland Center Stage, ACT Seattle, The Arcola Theatre in London, The Galway Arts Festival at the Druid Theatre, and at the Traverse at Edinburgh Festival. *Until the Flood* was also performed in Berlin at the Schaubuhne Theatre in

April of 2022 and at the Spoleto Festival in Charleston, SC in June of 2022. Ms. Orlandersmith is working on a commission for Rattlestick Theatre called Watching the Watcher, and had two plays opening at Milwaukee Repertory Theatre in 2022–NEW AGE-directed by Jade King Carroll and Antonio's Song/I Was Dreaming of a Son directed by Mark Clements which opened at the Goodman Theatre Spring 2023. Ms. Orlandersmith's new play SPIRITUS/ VIRGIL'S DANCE commissioned by Merrimack Repertory Theatre in Massachusetts was done at CATF Theatre in West Virginia Summer of 2023 and Rattlestick and Merrimack Theaters in 2024. Ms. Orlandersmith is currently working with writer/performer David Cale and director Robert Falls on a play called You Don't Know the Lonely One. Ms Orlandersmith received a Doris Duke Award in 2020.

## NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

I heard Dael before I met her. One night in the early 1990s I went to the Nuyorican Poets Cafe on the lower east side. Dael was one of the poets who read their work that night. I was struck by her ferocity and kindness. She balanced clinical observation with an open, empathetic heart. She was, and remains, a uniquely compelling presence. I am grateful that the conversation we began that night has lasted for almost 40 years.

Over that time we have had the great fortune to present Dael's plays throughout the country and across Europe. Because of that, we have spent a lot of time walking together in many very different cities. I love these times because I get to be with Dael when she is observing people going about their daily lives. She has an uncanny ability to watch people and pick up on their states of mind and the circumstances of their lives. On these walks I get to witness the beginning of her process and the observations and empathy that will lead to complex characters and new plays that challenge and welcome us all.

*Spiritus/Virgil's Dance* is about the search for vocation, for purpose. The very human drive to find value and fulfillment. Our work on the play has paralleled that search. It was born, perhaps unconsciously, from the pandemic. Dael knew that the crisis forced us all to confront our notions of life and death. As those of us fortunate to make it through and began to return to life, Dael was interested in how we would navigate our fears of death and our recognition that we had been given an opportunity to find new paths.

When Dael first wrote and performed *Spiritus/Virgil's Dance* we were all, like Virgil, reemerging from the land of the dead. We had witnessed the Inferno and were in a process of reflection and discovery, and action. I know that the play will continue to shift and grow as people move on in that process. Appropriately, that process harkens back to Dante. We suddenly discovered ourselves in an unknown world, a world that had changed enough to be, in some ways, unrecognizable. What is the way forward? Which path to take?

In the play, Virgil is keenly aware of the power and importance of time. Time has been a blessing and force in my relationship with Dael. Over nearly four decades, we have become trusted traveling partners, geographically and spiritually. Time has let us build mutual trust and respect. Collaborating with Dael is a way to support her deep, life-long exploration of the world and what humans do to find their way through the dark woods. I am grateful that she has invited me along.
