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WHO'S WHO?

G. GORDON LIDDY (1930-2021)

G. Gordon Liddy was an American lawyer and former FBI agent best known for his role in the Watergate Scandal. Along with E. Howard Hunt, Liddy orchestrated the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters in 1972, an attempt at gaining intel and helping Richard Nixon win re-election. Liddy served eight years in prison for burglary, conspiracy, and illegal wiretapping. In 1980, Liddy published his autobiography, *Will*.

RICHARD LEAKEY (1944-2022)

Richard Leakey was a Kenyan-born paleoanthropologist and conservationist. Leakey's discovery of numerous early human fossils provided the field of anthropology with significant insight into human evolution and its origins in Africa.

SHIRLEY CHISHOLM (1924-2005)

Shirley Chisholm was an American politician. In 1968, she became the first Black woman elected to the United States Congress. She served seven terms representing New York's 12th congressional district and became a well-known champion of racial and gender equality. In 1972, she became the first Black American to run for president and the first woman to run for the Democratic Party's presidential nomination.

PATTY HEARST (1954-)

Born into a wealthy publishing family, Patty Hearst became the subject of public interest when she was kidnapped from her Berkeley apartment and held for ransom by the anarchist Symbionese Liberation Army in 1974. Hearst allegedly suffered confinement and humiliation by the SLA, who coerced her into saying she joined the group of her own accord. Hearst was convicted of armed robbery in 1976 along with other members of the SLA, and she served time in prison before her sentence was commuted in 1979.

RUPERT MURDOCH (1931-)

Newspaper publisher and media magnate Rupert Murdoch is best known for News Corp, a media and publishing company that oversaw an empire that once included Fox News, 20th Century Fox, *The Wall Street Journal, The Sun*, and *The Times*.

ISAAC STERN (1920-2001)

Isaac Stern was a Ukrainian-born American violinist. Hailed as one of the greatest musicians of the $20^{\rm th}$ Century, Stern is also well-remembered for his successful campaign to save Carnegie Hall from demolition in 1960. The Isaac Stern Auditorium at Carnegie Hall is named in his honor.

GERALDINE FERRARO (1935-2011)

Geraldine Ferraro was an American politician and attorney. She served in the United States House of Representatives and was the Democratic vice-presidential nominee alongside Walter Mondale in 1984. She was the first female vice-presidential nominee put forth by a major party.

WHAT'S WHAT

PEPSODENT

An American toothpaste brand that peaked in consumer popularity in the 1940s and 1950s.

HOWARD JOHNSON'S

The now-defunct Howard Johnson's was one of the first national restaurant chains in the United States. It was known for its orange and teal interior design scheme and menu of American culinary favorites, including ice cream, pancakes, burgers, and yes, fried clams.

NOBEL SPERM BANK

The Nobel Sperm Bank, also known as the Hermann J. Muller Repository for Germinal Choice, was a sperm bank in California founded in 1980 by Robert Klark Graham. Graham, a eugenicist, hoped to create a genius generation by only accepting sperm donations from Nobel Laureates. However, with few Nobel Laureates willing to donate, the bank was forced to rely on donations from celebrated academics and, later, athletes.

PETER PRINCIPLE

Developed by Laurence J. Peter, the Peter Principle states that competent employees in workplace hierarchies will continue to climb the ladder of success, continually being promoted until they reach a level where they are no longer competent.

ANDY WARHOL'S CAMPBELL'S SOUP CANS

Painted in 1962, Warhol's *Campbell's Soup Cans* is one of the most celebrated pieces of modern art. It is a series of 32 canvases, each canvas depicting a different flavor of Campbell's soup.

UPANISHADS

The Upanishads are a series of late-Vedic Hindu texts that explore humanity's role within the interconnected universe.

WOMEN'S STRIKE FOR EQUALITY MARCH

Organized by Betty Friedan and the National Organization for Women (NOW), The Women's Strike for Equality March in 1970 marked the 50th anniversary of women's suffrage in the United States. In New York City, 50,000 women marched, chanted, and blocked traffic, demanding free abortion, free childcare, and equal opportunities in the workforce and education.

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

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

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
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
