Dear MRT Community,

Welcome to our production of *Lady Day at Emerson's Bar and Grill.* This production highlights one of the most venerable jazz artists of all time, Billie Holiday. Her distinctive voice and powerful delivery have influenced generations. We know her sound to carry depth, languor, sadness, and searing protest. Her story amplifies one of the subtlest promises of American culture: the freedom to make art.

Billie made her recording debut in 1932 at the age of eighteen with the Benny Goodman Orchestra. Even with accolades like this, the piece also dives under any shiny veneer. Billie's life was filled with hardship; the child of teenage parents, public struggles with addiction, and abusive relationships. We return to the play because it presents beguiling challenges to theatre artists today. Many of her songs speak to her towering, if not always manageable pain.

I am honored to welcome Jenece Upton to the MRT stage to play the titular role. In casting, we needed an artist who brought forth the song-making zeal of Billie, her monumental personality, and soulful sound. Jenece brings those



qualities in abundance. The virtuoso David Coleman on piano makes for a dynamic pairing. We are grateful to welcome David to the MRT stage and delighted to offer an opportunity for him to "complete" the run of *Lady Day* which he was slated to perform at another theatre in March of 2020 before Covid closures. Finally, the directing leadership of Candice Handy ensures you are in for a nuanced, character-cogent, visceral evening of theatre. You may remember Candice from MRT's production of *Gaslight* last year and we are honored to have her return in this capacity. She has brought extraordinary grit, tenacity, and clarity to this process. Special nod to the rest of the design team who have crafted this world with care and mindfulness.

As always, this work is done in full collaboration with MRT staff, board, and volunteers. I thank them for their tireless pursuit of bringing artistic excellence to our audiences. Enjoy the show.
